





Introducing the ECOL Project: Ecological Education and Out-of-School Learning

The **ECOL Project** (2024-1-RO01-KA220-SCH-000243521) is a transformative initiative funded by the European Union, focusing on ecological education through innovative, engaging, and inclusive methods. With the involvement of six international partners, this project aims to empower students with the knowledge, skills, and awareness needed to address environmental challenges and foster sustainable practices.

Project Overview

The innovative use of **drama as a teaching method** will enhance the educational experience, making environmental learning interactive, practical, and meaningful. By focusing on fostering environmental literacy, social responsibility, and community involvement, ECOL is paving the way for a greener future.

Project Goals and Objectives

1. Environmental Literacy

The project aims to equip students with action-oriented environmental literacy skills, enabling them to understand and actively address ecological issues in their communities.

- 2. Social Participation By encouraging participation in real-world ecological activities, students will develop essential social skills and become active contributors to environmental protection efforts.
- 3. Holistic Development ECOL emphasizes students' physical, cognitive, and social growth while cultivating a strong sense of environmental responsibility.

Planned Activities

The ECOL Project will span two years (October 2024 – September 2026), with diverse activities designed to engage students, educators, and communities:

1. Piloting Educational Practices

An eight-week piloting phase will take place in all participating schools. This phase focuses on activities conducted in outdoor environments, complemented by in-class sessions using drama and digital applications. Key topics include:

- Tree planting initiatives
- Habitat protection for animals
- Raising awareness about the role of soil, forests, and oxygen in sustaining life

2. International and Local Meetings

To foster collaboration and knowledge exchange, the project includes:

- **Transnational meetings (M1-M4):** Bringing together partners to share insights and coordinate project implementation.
- Local dissemination events (E1-E7): Engaging communities to share project outcomes and promote ecological awareness.

3. Mobility and Training Opportunities

- **Student mobility (C2):** Enabling students to experience ecological education in different cultural contexts.
- **Staff training (C1):** Equipping educators with the tools and knowledge to effectively implement the program.

Expected Outcomes and Deliverables

The ECOL Project will produce a range of resources and materials to support ecological education, including:

- 1. Ecological Education Program: A comprehensive curriculum designed for schools.
- 2. Ecological Education Guide for Teachers: Practical strategies and methodologies for teaching ecological topics effectively.
- 3. **Outdoor Ecological Education Interactive Book:** A dynamic resource for educators and students, promoting hands-on learning.
